

## **The Mayhem Continues!**

As I told you in last month's article, the GWRRA MAP concentrates on three related aspects of motorist awareness through a Share the Road Campaign. Awareness Education, Awareness Advertisement, and Public Relations are all designed to create a thought process among motorists that includes a heightened awareness of the motorcycles that are present on highways and byways all over the country. I promised to get into the details of the above three MAP approaches in future newsletter articles. And, I will. I promise. But not this month. Please recall that man plans, God laughs!

My best laid plans have been overcome by eye opening statistics from the Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) that I wanted to share with you prior to the beginning of riding season. Let me begin with a Jan 2016 CDOT report showing that preliminary data indicated that traffic fatalities rose by 10% in 2015. In other words, there were 545 traffic fatalities in 2015 compared to 488 in 2014 (the 545 number was ultimately increased to 547). And now, the number you are REALLY interested in: An all time record high 104 motorcycle fatalities occurred in 2015, a 10.6% increase over the 94 fatalities in 2014! And if that news was not bad enough, of the 545 traffic fatalities in 2015, Jefferson County had the highest number, 56, followed by Weld, 55, Denver, 49, and El Paso, 44. Unsurprisingly, 32% of these fatalities, or 174, were alcohol related. The only good news in this report was that CDOT had budgeted \$300,000 in FY2016 on motorcycle safety campaigns targeting both drivers and motorcycle riders.

But this is old news, right? What has happened recently? Things have surely gotten better, haven't they? NOT! A January 30, 2017, article in the Denver Post reported that deaths on Colorado's roadways jumped about 11% in 2016 to 605, a total that includes a 15-year-high number of pedestrians (84) and bicyclists (16) killed! A 20%+ increase in the past two years alone and now a 6-year-rise in Colorado traffic fatalities! Officials blame this continuing increase on everything from distracted to impaired driving, to low seat belt use, and to motorcyclists not wearing helmets and other protective gear. Sam Cole, CDOT's traffic safety communications manager, says, "This is an emerging crisis in Colorado." Cole went on to say that motorcycle fatalities are also up, about 50% in the past few years (125 deaths in 2016!).

A month into 2017, 20 people have been killed on Colorado roads, a number that will surely sky rocket once we transition into Colorado's gorgeous spring, summer, and fall driving and riding seasons. As you can plainly see, Colorado drivers are the primary suspects behind the increased fatalities noted above. Motorcyclists, pedestrians, and bicyclists are not killing 600+ people a year. I believe the GWRRA MAP has an opportunity to make a positive impact on Colorado drivers. I hope to convince other MAP Coordinators in Colorado to work with CDOT officials to do whatever we (all Gold Wing riders in Colorado) can to participate in programs aimed at reducing crashes, especially those involving motorcycles!!!


Joseph Stalin was quoted as saying that "One death is a tragedy; one million is a statistic." I hope Colorado officials are not becoming numb to the rising number of deaths occurring on Colorado's roadways and accepting these numbers as mere statistics.

**Ft. Robinson! Here we come!****Day 1 of the Ride**


I have plagiarized much of the article from the 2014 Ft. Robinson ride with some items added, some deleted and some changed.... all in the hope of protecting the innocent.

The Chapter L ride to Ft. Robinson, Nebraska, will be packed with some really exciting activities during all 3 days, June 9-11, of the ride.

Day 1 will take us from our usual starting location at the Loaf 'n Jug located at Union and Cedar Streets in Lakewood. The departure time will be somewhere between 7 – 8 AM with the exact time being determined and announced later. The beginning of the day we will be riding north on I-25, I know, "Oh my, how very exciting." There will be a fuel and bio stop in Cheyenne. We will proceed north from Cheyenne and pass by Wheatland. Once past Wheatland we will turn East on US 26 with Guernsey, Wyoming, as our next destination.

WOW! Guernsey, Wyoming, I can hardly wait! Things are really getting exciting now! Enough already! For those of you who have never been to Guernsey, or perhaps you have and didn't know, there are two very exciting historical sites located just outside of Guernsey.

The first historical site we will stop at is the '**Oregon Trail Wagon Ruts**' location. Here you will be able to walk a portion of the famous Oregon Trail and see where the horses, wagons and people crossed over a sandstone ridge and literally wore deep ruts in the sandstone. You will want to be sure you have your camera ready.



Just a few miles east of the Oregon Trail Wagon Ruts location is another famous historical site known as '**Register Cliff**'. This site was a stopover location for the wagon trains headed West on the Oregon Trail. During their stop, many of the travelers carved their names and the date in the soft sandstone cliff. Along with the carvings on the sandstone cliff there is an old cemetery where many of those same travelers were buried.

We will have fuel, bio and lunch stop in Guernsey. Once we leave Guernsey we will continue East on US 26 past Fort Laramie, Wyoming, with a planned stop at the '**Fort Laramie National Historic Site**'. For more than 50 years the forces of Manifest Destiny swept past the doors of the

Fort on the Laramie River. Indians, trappers, traders, good seekers, overland pioneers, soldiers, and the Pony Express riders, each in their turn, found within its borders an outpost of white civilization in the midst of ancestral hunting grounds of the Plains Indians.

## Fort Robinson—Continued



The cottonwood log stockade fort, built in 1834 by fur trade entrepreneur William Sublette, was the first permanent society of white men on the Great Plains. However, it was not until the fort was sold to the American Fur Company in 1836 that it became a major fur trade center. In 1841, the old log fort was replaced by a larger adobe structure, one mile up the Laramie River. It was named Fort John, but was always known simply as Fort Laramie.

The promise of free land in Oregon and the lure of gold in California drew thousands of emigrants up the Platte River Valley by the 1840s. To protect these Argonauts and emigrants from increasingly frequent conflicts with the Indians, the US Army built a string of outposts along the Oregon Trail.

The location of Fort John near the confluence of the North Platte and Laramie Rivers assured the Army command of not only the east-west route, but also trails leading south along the Front Range of the Rockies, north into Sioux country around the Black Hills, and northwest into Montana. Purchased by the Army for \$4,000, the old fur trading post soon stood at the edge of a growing complex of new military buildings.

For the next 40 years Fort Laramie was the staging point from which troops were sent into the Indians' last strongholds, and twice was where Indians and soldiers came to make peace. In the end, this post, which for so long had aided travel to the west, was by-passed by the nation it helped expand. With the end of the Indian Wars in 1890, the post was abandoned and sold at public auction to the homesteads it had made possible.

Come join us as you, too, can quench your thirst at the Enlisted Men's Bar with a cool glass of root beer, apple cider or sarsaparilla. Now that you have refreshed yourself, it's time to complete our journey to Ft. Robinson.

The remainder of the day will be an enjoyable ride over the prairie grasslands, past the Soldier Creek Wilderness area and through the edge of the Nebraska State Forest. And you thought Nebraska was boring! Everyone can rest assured, if we see three of the largest bull elk standing in rolling grass hills, we will stop for pictures.....neither rain, sleet nor hail shall stop us from taking pictures!

Once we arrive at Ft. Robinson we will check into our rooms, have dinner in the Ft. Robinson dining room and if you want, we'll get tickets **for *Mamma Mia* at the Ft. Robinson Theater.**



Next month's article will talk about all the wonderful things to see and do at Ft. Robinson and the surrounding area.

I have a matching Bushtec trailer that I will sell with the bike for an additional negotiable amount if you are interested.




### Pets:


