As many of you know, back in September Mike and I took a side trip across the water to Victoria, B.C. We had never been there before, so we were anxious to see what the city had to offer. Believe me, we were not disappointed!

We decided to take only one bike, my trike, on the ferry as the cost was a little steep. And we decided to stay the night in a B & B to give us more time to tour the city. We soon learned there is a lot more to see than we had time for.

I've attached just a few pictures of some of the highlights of our visit. The parliament center overlooks the majestic Inner Harbour and is open year around. This is home to the Legislative Assembly of British Columbia. Guided tours are free and last approximately 30-45 minutes. Next time, we'll definitely plan to do this!



Another stop was to see the beautiful Butchart Gardens. This is a group of floral display gardens in Brentwood Bay, B.C. near Victoria. The gardens receive over a million visitors each year and are one of the top tourist attractions in Victoria. If you know me, you know how much I love flowers and I was in seventh heaven touring the gardens. The colors and combinations were spectacular.



As it turned out, our B & B was within walking distance to the infamous Fisherman's Wharf on the Inner Harbour, which is a unique marine destination with float homes and commercial vessels. The wharf offers fresh seafood, shops and eco-tour adventures. We were especially drawn to the unique float homes as you can see by the picture. It's not something I

Another fantastic sight was the Christ Church Cathedral, which is the cathedral church of the Diocese of British Columbia of the Anglican Church of Canada. We found it open to everyone and were free to tour the entire church. Hesitant at first, a janitor encouraged us to see a section up high beyond the sanctuary that gave us a fantastic view of the organ made of solid mahogany. It played the entire time we were in the

building and what a beautiful sound! Unfortunately, my pics did not do it justice, so I haven't included any.

The Craigdarroch Castle turned out to be another spectacular sight to see. I took many pictures as we toured all three floors but, unfortunately, I lost my phone there so have none to share with you. The castle is now a national historic site and was built by wealthy coal baron, Robert Dunsmuir. It is a stunning example of Victorian architecture, including exquisite stained-glass windows, woodwork and period antiques. We climbed 87 steps up the grand oak staircase to the Tower for the best views of Victoria. Even though I lost my phone I wouldn't have missed this stop for anything.

This is just a sampling of what Victoria has to offer. If you ever get the chance to visit I would encourage you to do so. I know we will return some day to enjoy the city even more.



A Little Bit of History...At Least our History By Fred Fisher, Treasurer

As many of you know, Linda and will be moving away from Colorado next summer. I plan to retire in July of this year and we will head to our new home in Bella Vista, Arkansas soon after to enjoy our retirement.

Over the next few months, I'd like to go back into our Chapter L history and share a few stories that were memorable moments.

First is: How did we end up in GWRRA and Chapter L?

I had been riding motorcycles since the early 1970's. In Ohio, I had a friend who owned a Honda dealership: Patrick's Honda in Fairborn, Ohio. At the time, they dealt mostly in sport bikes and some off-road stuff. In October of 1974, Honda decided to come out with this revolutionary new touring bike: The GL1000. All American Honda dealers were required to put one on the showroom floor.

Dave Patrick, owner of the dealership, told me, "This piece of s^*t will never sell." He offered it to me at his cost if I would take it off his floor. I did, and the rest is history.

Rode several different GL's over the years, but in June of 1994, we bought a 1985 GL1200 Limited Edition, the fancy fuel injected anniversary edition. In July, I rode the bike to Bandimere Speedway.

When I returned to the bike after the event, I found a business card stuck on the bike. It said, "I owned this bike. If you want to know its history, give me a call." I did call him to get some info. That person was Randy Berger, a GWRRA member since 1984 and a Charter Member of Chapter L. He invited us to attend a Chapter L meeting and the rest is history. We joined Chapter L in November of 1994. Back then, Chapter L met at Red Rocks Community College in Lakewood. Not long after that we moved to the Mark Starr Center that is across the street from our current location. We were not there long as we quickly outgrew that small meeting room. We then moved to the Clement Center and have been there ever since.

Next month, my first long "group ride" and how then Director Steve Randolph might have saved my life.


